

Doug Swisher developed the Madam X in the 1980's. It is most commonly considered a Stone Fly imitation, but the Madam X can also be tied as a cicada, grasshopper, crickets, and other large aquatic or terrestrial insect. The original pattern was composed mostly of Elk Hair using a yellow thread ribbing. The Madam X is usually tied with an underwing, or even a foam strip to ensure that it stays afloat in a "Hopper / Dropper" set up. Deer Hair can be substituted for the elk hair, particularly in smaller flies. The rubber legs add to the fly's movement and are a time tested fish attractor. For members who fish the Merced at this time of year. An Orange bodied version makes a great October Caddis pattern for late evening or early morning fishing.

Mick Micheli on the North Platte

“Who Are These Guys Anyway” an irreverent look at the people who make up the membership of the Salinas Valley Fly Fishers

This month we take a long look at one of our Life Members, **Mick Micheli**. Mick and Deb Micheli have been fixtures in our club for over thirty years.

Mick grew up in Castroville, moved to North Salinas in his mid 50's and now at age 70 is a full time, on the road, RVer. I'm not just sure how long Deb and Mick have been married, but we doubt that Mick can count that high. They have a son and daughter, Nick and Melanie and what they describe as a ton of grandkids and one great grandson

Amoung his other odd jobs, Mick started work for Hayward Lumber when he was in high school, then became a union carpenter, did finish carpentry and finally became a cabinet maker. In 1975 he began working with his father at Micheli Custom Woodworks. He took over the business in the early 90's and finally retired in 2016 and has been on the road ever since.

If you know Mick, you know that this guy has dabbled in just about everything over the years: surfing, snow & water skiing, dirt & street bikes, hang gliding, sail boarding, camping and hiking. Now days he just travels, plays his harmonica and looks for great places to fish.

Mick says that he first started fishing when he was 5 or 6 and taught himself how to fly cast when he was 12 years old. But, he didn't really get serious about it until his first trip to Alaska. The guide handed him a fancy high end fly rod and put him on a bunch of Silver and some big Rainbows and he and the fish were both hooked.

Mick and Deb joined the club in 1990 and before he knew it, he was on the Board and serving as Vice President under Bill Dickens. Ultimately he served serveral years on the Board and became one of a very few who served multiple terms as club President. later he was voted in as a SVFF Life Member.

When asked about favorite places to fish he mentioned New Zealand, the Sierras and Pyramid Lake. But his current favorite, with his recent travels under his belt, is Wyoming's North Platte River near Grey Reef. Like a lot of trout fisherman he sights trout as his favorite fish...mainly because of the beautiful places where they live. Mick ticked off three flies as his “go to” favorites: the Elk Hair Caddis for sure, the Flash Back Pheasant Tail Nymph and your basic Black Bugger.

When it comes to special club memories, He had a bucket full; a club outing at Lake Nacimiento when Deb, much to the chagrin of all the old guys, caught a near lake record White Bass, The three day float trip on the Deschutes with Rick McCombs, Frank Cunha and Clyde Green, A float down the Merced River in the middle of Yosemite Valley, and finally a trip down to Laredo with Sonny Wun and Fred DeYoung where he blew out his rotator cuff the first 30 minutes.

In closing Mick said: “I have learned so much from the guys and gals over the years. But, the best are the lifelong friendships we have made. Even though my life style now keeps me from being an active in the club, I am so proud to be a member of the Salinas Valley Fly Fishers.”
